You did that in SF and I hope you will help do it here in Sacramento, your adopted city. Please protect one of the most unique things about our city. Please be our advocate.

My opposition, and I hope yours, is based on the following concerns:

- Too expensive to justify for the return
- Bad timing given the financial and social impact of the Covid-19 pandemic
- Too much to lose in terms of 100 trees, history, visitor attraction, and a beautiful park
- Climate Change impacts are too severe, by removing trees that remove carbon, reduce the urban heat island effect, and improve air quality.
- There are other locations for a visitor center and parking that do not destroy a local treasure. After Covid 19 we may even rethink how we work and when we drive.
- There hasn't been any meaningful public dialog about the project or the options.

I ask that you work to halt the current project, especially any construction funds, and ask for a plan that costs less and protects this precious historical, environmental and community resource.
